One marvellous input into all the organisation was the re-arrangement of our large room at the back of the house with everything pushed to the sides, creating a surprising (to me) amount of room to sit the fifty-four people who came for the celebration.

We also have a good-sized covered back deck which was where the food was served, mainly out of three very large cauldrons with beef ragu, aubergine dhal, and kransky pasta, with salad and other options. A fire pit was lit on the patio to the side and kept grandchildren occupied in feeding it, while others chatted standing around it.

Towards the later part of the evening , after the second lot of music, we focused on Ruth's birthday with speeches and cake and Ruth thanked everyone for coming to share in the evening. A nice touch was that Ruth had gone through boxes

of photos and chosen a good number reflecting her life. Three posters crammed with photos and captions were blu-tacked around the windows and are still up in the corridor, bringing back many memories for both of us.

Our son, Aaron, over in Amsterdam, beautifully created a video of his own greetings and memories, and then in came all of Ruth's brothers and sisters

extremely successful, exciting, or impactful, usually beyond expectations. A Bruce Springsteen concert is the first thing that comes to my mind.


When I arrived in Roseville I did hope to spread the Good News and to share the news of the Lord's Second Coming, but I never expected to blow the roof off! But, that's nearly what happened on a blustery Saturday afternoon this past July.



The afternoon of 20 July I was going through my regular preparation for Sunday, at my desk setup at the back of the church sanctuary. It was a blustery day, to say the least, when suddenly, just after noon, I heard an extra loud gust of wind followed by a crashing sound over my head. The wind that day had torn one of our skylights from its frame and it shattered in the courtyard between the manse

and the church.

Thankfully, while this was a significant wind event, it was not also a rain event. The SES was called and they successfully secured a tarp over the hole in our roof. This was no easy task given that the roof of our church has a 45° pitch and is well over 10 metres at its peak.



Our Church Officer, Debra got straight to work coordinating with

our network of tradies. A scaffolding was erected within 3 weeks of the event and a new skylight was installed the following week.

We took advantage of the opportunity to access the roof by taking care of some other minor maintenance issues. These delayed improvements included; cleaning decades of lichen growth from the remaining skylights, patching several gutter leaks, installing bird spikes on the buttresses, repointing some brickwork and refurbishing some loose flashing.

I am grateful to both Debra and our long-cultivated network of tradies who turned a potential disaster into not much more than an inconvenience. A week ago, when the new skylight was installed and the building again was secure from weather, I immediately felt the weight or anxiety lift from my shoulders.
